Shop Hints & Tips

Cleaning Grinding wheels*** Using a nylon mesh scouring pad, go lightly over grinding wheels. This will remove contamination, The pad can be rinsed well and used time and time again.---- Chips 'Splinters via Carmel Valley Prospectors 2/88

Doublet or Triplet? *** To detect a doublet or a triplet—hold the stone with tongs in a white porcelain container of water. When viewed from the direction of the girdle, the various layers are obvious. ---- June clip Zeitner, Lapidary Journal via Mineralog

Sanding Turquoise **** Dipping a turquoise cab into water while sanding helps to keep it from glazing.---- Magic Valley Gem News 2/81

Sliver Tip **** Wash your sliver articles carefully with hot sudsy water after polishing with Tripoli or rouge. Tarnish reappears rapidly unless all traces of the polish are removed.----Golden Spike News 4/79

To loosen a rusted bolt: Apply a cloth wet with Coca Cola to the rusted bolt for several minutes.

To remove rust spots from Chrome car bumpers, rub the bumper with a crumpled-up piece of aluminum foil dipped in Coca Cola.

Clean your Pyrite by soaking your specimen overnight in a solution of oxalic acid, using two ounces of the acid to a quart of water. You can also soak them for an hour in Hydrochloric acid. Be sure to read the safety notes regarding the acids.*** via Tumble Rumble 3/96

Cleaning Druzy Specimens**** Use easy-off oven cleaner (fume free is ok and better for you). Spray the specimen and leave it overnight in a closed container or bag before rinsing. This also works on iron-stained quarts crystals. Steven Solovieff of Freedome Creations.
