Most of you know what Willow Creek Jasper looks like.

Larry spends a great deal of his time working at getting out the material from his claim. He says that the best part of finding the jasper is sharing it with fellow rockhounds so they can have some really good material to cut & polish. We can remember one of the first times of going to Willow Creek and checking out the then abandoned claim. Mary, Larry, Gene & myself down on our hand a lees trying to break off a little piece of jasper about the size of willow Creek and really found a piece of jasper. That was the start of it all. Now Willow Creek Jasper has been featured.

Now that Mary & Larry are retired they can spend part of their winters in Quartzsite. Arizona. They were able to buy property and get out a few times to look for rock or just ride around on their ATV. Larry has a booth at the Desert Gardens location so that takes up most of his time. He enjoys swapping stories and showing of rock: to every one who stops to visit.
