## **Orma J. Smith Museum of Natural History**

Have you been to the museum lately? The Orma J. Smith Museum of Natural History features specimens representing the Biology and Geology of SW Idaho, SE Oregon, and northern Nevada. The focal point of the museum is the Evans Gem and Mineral Collections. Curator, Nathan Carpenter, continues to expand the displays and welcomes visitors as well as assistance from volunteers to help build and maintain the displays, conduct tours and classes, and identify and label specimens.

The museum hosts a workday and seminar the <u>first Saturday</u> of every month and will host the annual event, "**Night at the Museum**," from 7-9 pm on September 15<sup>th</sup>. The evening will include award presentations in Boone Hall room 103 and tours of the Museum. Showing only six specific collecting sites on the map in no way should imply that those are the only places you should inspect. It is not out of the question to stumble upon something of value. While driving on any of the ruts that crisscross through the Glass Butte area, keep an eye out for places where previous rockhounds have been digging. Those pits often indicate something special was found there, and it might be worth making a stop to investigate

An important word of caution is essential here. Be certain you do not attack an obsidian deposit without wearing gloves and eye protection. Sharp glass splinters and chips fly through the air when struck with a hammer, and severe eye damage could be caused by just one of them
