


I have been busy giving rock classes to kids, ages 3-16 since April of 2019. I have given classes to 132 kids and 40 adults. I now teach these classes in my garage or sometimes out in the field while searching for rocks and minerals. I have had as few as four to as many as 15 in a class, not including adults. I have been amazed at the amount of young ones who are sincerely interested in the hobby of rock hounding. I now include in my classes the various uses of rock in everyday life and tell them that most of them have eaten a rock (salt), lived in rock (sheet rock), driven in rocks

(vehicles), brushed their teeth with rocks (flourite), talked on rocks (cell phones), etc. (the list is pretty extensive) and their eyes get very big when they are told how much rock there is in their lives. The youth are pretty attentive because I make sure every table has rocks they can touch and look at while I am talking. They love looking at rocks through magnifiers and I currently have 12 of them. They are fascinated with ores, pumice (the magic rock), minerals and fossils. They pick up, examine and feel the rocks in my collection. Many parents tells me afterwards their kids are so fascinated by the boxed collection each student gets in the classes that they take them with them everywhere. I now am making larger collections of Igneous, Sedimentary, Metamorphic Rock and some minerals to take to science classes in select schools. I will keep you informed if that endeavor is successful.
