Buckets, Shovels, Rock Hammer, Pick (Large and Small), Sieve, Gloves, Spray Bottle for Water, Small Scrub Brush, Knee Pads, Magnifier, Plenty of Drinking Water, Food, Appropriate Clothing, Protective Eyewear, Sun Protection, Day Pack or Back Pack, Umbrella, Pry Bar, Tick Spray, First Aid Kit, Protective clothing and sunscreen to avoid burns.

Shovel and fire extinguisher to put out any fires that may start.

- •Trips can last most of the day.
- •Generally, a High-Clearance vehicle and sometimes 4WD or an ATV is required.
- •Please remember to not park on tall grass or sagebrush as the fire season is in full swing and watch out for snakes.
- •When you are finished, fill in all holes that are dug at the site.

New Business: Dale and Chris Rawson attended the Board meeting with some ideas for Show prizes, Paul will follow with them.



We will have all the **sign-up sheets** at the Christmas



Community Corner

Hello fellow rock lovers, meet Violet Martin, the new geology teacher at Capital High School in Boise. Violet's area of expertise is in earth sciences and for several years she was a horticulture teacher. But she needed a change!

I met Violet online after she posted on a rock Facebook page that she needed rocks and minerals for her new assignment as a geology teacher Rockhounders can be very generous and she got lots of positive responses on her post. I contacted her on behalf of Owyhee Gem & Mineral Society letting her know that I taught kids rock classes and might have some of the more common rocks (like sandstone, basalt, granite, etc) that she might need. She responded back quickly and we set up a time for her to come visit me. She



confided that most people she contacted had a lot of rocks...but not necessarily what she needed to teach with. She is passionate about having the right resources so her students get a full learning experience in her three geology classes. She has several planned field trips but needed her kids to have hands on experience with rocks & minerals. Her wish list included 13 different types of minerals, 3 sedimentary rocks, 8 igneous, 7 metamorphic rocks...and she wanted 10 of each type so she could make specimen kits for 2-3 students to share. That is a total of 310 specimen! We have been working together for 2 months to fulfill her wish list. I went to Don Dixon's home where he & Cindy donated several boxes of minerals to the cause. Violet found basalt and sandstone on her own and we were able to fill 90% of her list with rocks & minerals I had on hand or purchased on behalf of the OGMS. The 3 types of rocks I

didn't have: gabbro, dacite & phyllite, Violet was able to purchase out of teacher funds the principal gave her. I plan on making other kits like these to donate to geology teachers and am sharing her list in the hopes that club members could keep their eyes open for some of them and donate to educating the next generation of rockhounders.

The specimen only need to be 1'' - 3''. Bigger specimen I can cut/chisel into smaller sizes. Geology teacher's wish list:

<u>Minerals:</u> Galena, pyrite, hematite, quartz, gypsum, sulfur, talc, halite, calcite, feldspar, biotite, muscovite, magnetite. (*I added fluorite*)

Sedimentary: sandstone. conglomerate, limestone, chert

<u>Igneous:</u> basalt, ryholite, andesite, pumice, gabbro, pegmatite, dacite, diorite, obsidian

<u>Metamorphic:</u> marble, gneiss, slate, soapstone, schist, quartzite, phyllite

If you have or find any of these rocks/minerals you would like to donate please call or text me and I will gladly pick them up. Sincerely, Karen Davis (208-409-8936)

Rockhounds' Code of Ethics

I will respect both private and public property and will do no collecting on privately owned land without permission from the owner.

I will keep informed on all laws, regulations or rules governing collecting on public lands and will observe them.

I will, to the best of my ability, ascertain the boundary lines of property on which I plan to collect.

I will use no firearms or blasting material in collecting areas.

I will cause no willful damage to property of any kind such as fences, signs, buildings, etc.

I will leave all gates as found.

I will build fires only in designated or safe places and will be certain they are completely extinguished before leaving the area.

I will discard no burning material – matches, cigarettes, etc.

I will fill all excavation holes which may be dangerous to livestock.

I will not contaminate wells, creeks, or other water supplies.

I will cause no willful damage to collecting material and will take home only what I can reasonably use.

I will practice conservation and undertake to utilize fully and well the materials I have collected and will recycle my surplus for the pleasure and benefit of others.

I will support the rockhound project H.E.L.P. (Help Eliminate Litter Please) and will leave all collecting areas devoid of litter, regardless of how found.

I will cooperate with field-trip leaders and those in designated authority in all collecting areas.


The Owyhee Gem and Mineral Society was established in 1938 at the College of Idaho in Caldwell, Idaho.
