## January Birthstone—Garnet

The star garnet is the official Idaho gemstone.

Six-ray Idaho Star Garnets from Emerald Creek are the most valuable and best quality star garnets known. Most star garnets from this locality are a very dark purple, and show their color best in sunlight or other bright, direct lighting. The unique color of Emerald Creek garnets comes from mineral impurities within the garnet. The core of the Emerald Creek garnet is rich in manganese whereas the rims are rich in iron and magnesium. Some star garnets have inclusions that reflect the light in such a way that looks as if the garnet has fine glitter just below the surface. The Star phenomenon comes from a sufficient amount of rutile, a mineral composed of titanium oxide, arranged along the crystal planes of the stone.

## Other Idaho Gemstone Legacies

### Bruneau Jasper

Commonly known as a “thunder egg” formation, Bruneau Jasper is solely found in Bruneau Canyon in Idaho. This formation is so rare it is often used for exhibition and for some types of jewelry. It is highly prized by rockhounds and lapidarists alike.

Its hardness produces a pearl-like luster when polished by experts. Yet its depth and flowing reds and tans are responsive to the skills of the lapidary hobbyist.

This stone is available in only one area along the sheer walls of Bruneau Canyon. Since the claim is privately held, permission to dig for this semi-precious formation is given infrequently making Bruneau Jasper a valuable addition to any rockhound's collection.

### Plume Agate

This particular form of agate from the Owyhee Mountains of Idaho and Oregon got its name from its beautiful plume--like shapes. The colors range from a creamy white to yellow, pinks and different shades of blue. Iron Pyrite adds a sparkling touch of gold.

With the inclusion of browns and blacks from other minerals, fascinating scenes of animals, trees, and other shapes can be imagined.

In 1941, the late Dudley Stewart found what is now known as the Idaho Plume Agate near the location of Graveyard Point, close to the border of Idaho and Oregon. Although still called Idaho Plume Agate, the claims now being worked are located just over the border in Oregon.

Agate is one of many members of the Quartz family. As a hard and durable stone, polished pieces of Plume Agate can become beautiful and lasting jewelry.

so everyone knows who you are.





To encourage as wide a participation as possible in the "Rock Hound" hobby and the many activities that go along with it.


