

Buckets, Shovels, Rock Hammer, Pick (Large and Small), Sieve, Gloves, Spray Bottle for Water, Small Scrub Brush, Knee Pads, Magnifier, Plenty of Drinking Water, Food, Appropriate Clothing, Protective Eyewear, Sun Protection, Day Pack

or Back Pack, Umbrella, Pry Bar, Tick Spray, First Aid Kit, Shovel and fire extinguisher to put out any fires that may start.

Trips can last most of the day.
Generally, a High-Clearance vehicle and sometimes 4WD or an ATV is required.

Remember, when you are finished, fill in all holes that are dug at the site.



Rockhounding in Idaho

Rockhounding - Department of Lands (idaho.gov)

Idaho is truly the Gem State. Since the origin of the earth, geologic processes combined to make the rocks of Idaho a mineral collector's storehouse. This, coupled with the beautiful forests and streams, makes Idaho the place where the rock collector's dreams come true.

Rockhounding on State Endowment Trust Land

All state endowment trust lands are open to casual exploration for gemstones and mineral specimens, provided the lands are not under a valid exploration location or mineral lease. Information regarding status of state endowment trust lands can be obtained from the IDL field offices.

Mineral Leases and Exploration Locations

A **mineral lease** allows you to mine and remove larger amounts of minerals from state endowment land.

An **exploration location** gives you the exclusive right to explore and prospect for gold and other locatable minerals on state endowment trust lands not already under location or lease. Exploration locations may also be filed on the beds of navigable rivers and streams between the ordinary high water marks.

Rockhounding on Public Land

Rockhounds are welcome to collect rocks and gemstones from most public land administered by the U.S. Forest Service or the Bureau of Land Management, but there are some exceptions. Contact the agencies directly for more information.



GENE BABBITT-MEMORIAL

DEC 6, 1933 - OCT 24, 2021

This picture was taken just three short weeks before Gene left us. He was cutting rocks for three of his grandchildren showing them how to open a rock to share all it's glory.

I have had the honor of writing memorials for several rockhounds over the years but this is the hardest one of all. My husband will no longer hunt for or cut rocks here on earth but our memories will live on.

Owyhee Gem and Mineral society became a big part of our lives after joining in 1984 thanks to Bill and Anna Stringer.

Gene's contributions to the club were many. He gladly took on the jobs of joint Bulletin Editor and helping with the field trips. The Northwest Federation started an Endowment Fund so Gene became the 1st to take on the challenges as Chairman.



Can you imagine loading your 18-inch rock saw onto a trailer to take to a club show? Gene did so people could see a rock being cut, it was a big hit. A sand dig for treasures was one of Genes ideas to involve the Pebble Pups in the club so the dig was started with the young ones running the booth.

School students are always interested in rocks so it was natural to take a small trim saw and grinder into the classrooms. Students were shown they could cut their own rock by trimming off the end of a small petrified limb and then polish it. That wasn't enough for some schools. They were able to follow us in a bus on a field trip to find petrified wood on their own. What a thrill that was for the students, teachers and us.

Exploring Idaho contacted us to do a segment on Idaho Rockhounds so Gene enlisted the help of fellow club members to take the film crew to the Big Egg Claim. The segment ended with David Mills TV Crew filming the eggs being cut and then how to use them in display, jewelry, book ends etc.

The Nampa Library gave Gene another opportunity to advance the rockhound hobby. He brought his trimsaw/ grinder and more small petrified limbs so kids could cut and polish. Many fellow members brought their rocks, fossils and talents to share. Free bags of tumble polished rocks were also given to each student to take home.

Of all the activities he enjoyed his biggest was walking the hills in search of that one great find of the day. There were many great finds over the years both in Idaho and Arizona where 38 winters were spent with adventures and friends.
