

NATIONAL PARKS PASS FEE INCREASE

If you are over 62 years, and don't already have your National Park Lifetime Senior Pass, you might think about getting one soon because on December 16th, 2016, Congress passed into law the National Park Centennial Act. The lifetime pass provides access to more than 2,000 recreation sites managed by five Federal agencies, including National parks, campgrounds, and historical sites, for a bargain rate, to this point, of only \$10.

With the passing of the Centennial Act though There will be a price increase to help raise funds for direly needed repairs to parks. The new lifetime fee will be \$80. For further information, go to www.store.usgs.gov/pass/senior.html.


