Buckets, Shovels, Rock Hammer, Pick (Large and Small one), Sieve, Gloves, Spray Bottle for Water, Small Scrub Brush, Knee Pad's, Magnifier, Plenty of Drinking Water, Food, Appropriate Clothing, Protective Eyewear, Sun Protection, Day Pack or Back Pack, Umbrella, Pry Bar, Tick Spray. Shovel and fire extinguisher to put out any fires that may start.

Trips can last most of the day. Generally, a High-Clearance vehicle and sometimes 4WD or an ATV is required. Remember, when you are finished, fill in all holes that are dug at the Site.

# This Month's Speaker is Steve Brittenham giving a talk on FOSSILIZATION.

"An introduction to the science of paleontology: barely scratching the surface of our past".

Steve was interested in the physical sciences from an early age, wreaking havoc at home by always disassembling household appliances (but to his mother's chagrin, only occasionally successful reassembling them). During his middle and high school years, he was the photo-typical "geek" entering several local and regional science fairs, and as a senior he was selected as one of 40 national Westinghouse Science Talent search finalists for his work on ionic cooling.

He attended UC Berkeley as an electrical engineering and computer science student with an emphasis on bio electronics.

Instead of a career in his chosen studies he landed a job at Hewlett-Packard here in Idaho helping to start up their new disk drive business. Ostensibly a two year stint, after 36 years working on mass storage products, he retired in 2013, which allows more time for he and his wife to spend on rocks, fossils, and meteorites.

The Museum is open to all visitors: Monday-Friday from 1-5 pm, and the first Saturday of every month from 8-5.


