<u>October 26</u>: **Haystack Butte* for Red Jasper. Meet at the Homedale, ID Park tank just E of the four corners. (Meet @ 8am - leave @ 8:30)

USEFUL ITEMS TO BRING ON YOUR TRIP

Buckets, Shovels, Rock Hammer, Pick (Large and Small one), Sieve, Gloves, Spray Bottle for Water, Small Scrub Brush, Knee Pad's, Magnifier, Plenty of Drinking Water, Food, Appropriate Clothing, Protective Eyewear, Sun Protection, Day Pack or Back Pack, Umbrella, Pry Bar, Tick Spray. (Shovel and fire extinguisher to put out any fires that may start.)

Trips can last most of the day. Generally, a High-Clearance vehicle and sometimes 4WD or an ATV is required. **Remember, when you are finished, fill in all holes that are dug at the Site.**



Hello All, we had a great day while out looking for Leaf Fossils. It was a sunny day and the road in was in great shape which made for an easy trip in. We had 23 people total to include 8 guests and everyone went home with something.





Our next trip out will be to our Blue Egg Claim just west of Succor Creek Park. Here you will find some great thunder eggs but it will require some digging.

While out earlier this year checking on the claim there was remarkable Blue thunder egg found by Roxanne's husband which displayed some stunning fire in the blue opal. Not all the eggs are blue and many different varieties can be found out there, so come on out and try your luck at getting some great material. We will be meeting at the park in Homedale @ 8AM and leaving by 8:30AM on September 21st weather permitting. The drive out will take about 1.5 hours give or take. You will need a vehicle with ground clearance for the last part into the claim and 4WD is recommended.

Tools you will need on the trip should include eye protection, rock hammer, pick, chisels and pry bars. A small hand brush to help clean out seams is also handy. These eggs are buried in hard material so be prepared for some hard digging and maybe sweat a little too. Come on out to try your luck at getting some real beauties. There is no shade so please dress accordingly. It will be a little cool in the morning and hotter throughout the day. This has, to my knowledge, been a fun trip for most and each year people dig some fantastic eggs.



GRAB BAG CONTEST!!!


THIS IS THE PATTERN AND INSTRUCTIONS FOR GRAB BAGS WE FILL WITH TUMBLED ROCKS FOR OUR ANNUAL ROCK & GEM SHOW:

There will be prizes for 1st and 2nd for the greatest number of grab bags sewn and turned in to Kathi Larson. The deadline to turn the bags in is December 18th (our Christmas Party). Winners will be announced and prizes rewarded at our January 15th meeting. Donations of fabric are always welcomed. Happy sewing!

Easy Grab Bags

The easiest method of cutting out grab bags is to first cut out a cardboard pattern 8 1/2 x 11 inches. Lay the pattern on the material and trace around it with white chalk. Cut out material. The strings are made of any heavy cord cut into 24 inch lengths. (Rug yarn is good — strong and colorful) Before sewing, press the folds with a hot iron or crease with the fingers to make the sewing job easier. Follow the diagrams below to sew.

WHEEL OF GEMS: Guests spin a wheel for a prize on the coordinated prize board.

GRAB BAGS: Guests purchase a bag of tumbled rocks. If there is a "golden rock" in their bag, they can select a "special" prize.
