

## Federation Director—Ed Moser



Howard, a member of OGMS and for many years an amateur geologist, will give a talk during the September club meeting on the basics of minerals, rocks and fossils, and share some things he has learned as a long-time amateur geologist. During his talk, Mr. Emry will explain the difference between a mineral and a rock, and in simple terms describe how minerals and rocks are formed. He will also explain how all rocks on Earth are constantly changing into new ones through the Rock Cycle process. He plans to display a few minerals and rocks to aid his presentation. He also hopes to tell those attending what is a fossil and by using a few actual fossils as examples, show how fossils help us to learn about previous climate changes.

So come to the meeting and see a fellow rockhound share with you some things about basic geology.

#### Fossils and Minerals Displayed at the Caldwell Public Library

During the month of August 2022, two displays on geology were shown near the front entrance of the Caldwell Public Library. The displays were sponsored by the Owyhee Gem and Mineral Society and designed and exhibited by Howard and Darlene Emry, who are long-time members of the club. One display was about the Tempskya Tree Fern, an odd-looking plant that lived during the Early Cretaceous Period when dinosaurs roamed the earth. The exhibit described how this ancient fern grew and what it looked like when it was alive over 100 million years ago. The exhibit showed fossilized Tempskya Fern wood that was found many years ago by the couple near the small community of Wayan which is located in southeastern Idaho.

The other library exhibit had on display many specimens of different kinds of minerals. The exhibit described the basic characteristics of a mineral and showed how minerals come in many shapes and sizes. Because of their different shades of colors and sparkling crystals, Howard says that minerals are very beautiful to behold and should be displayed for people to enjoy.


Howard ways that there are two main reasons why he and his wife, Darlene, put in geology displays at the Caldwell Public Library and elsewhere:

- Encourage those who visit the library to attend meetings and become members of the Owyhee Gem and Mineral Society.
- 2. To inform and educate the public to the various aspects of the exciting world of geology and reveal to the community the beauty that is found in minerals, rocks, and fossils.
