

USEFUL ITEMS TO BRING ON YOUR FIELD TRIP

Buckets, Shovels, Rock Hammer, Pick (Large and Small), Sieve, Gloves, Spray Bottle for Water, Small Scrub Brush, Knee Pads, Magnifier, Plenty of Drinking Water, Food, Appropriate Clothing, Protective Eyewear, Sun Protection, Day Pack or Back Pack, Umbrella, Pry Bar, Tick Spray, First Aid Kit, Protective clothing and sunscreen to avoid burns.

Shovel and fire extinguisher to put out any fires that may start.

- •Trips can last most of the day.
- •Generally, a High-Clearance vehicle and sometimes 4WD or an ATV is required.
- •Please remember to not park on tall grass or sagebrush as the fire season is in full swing and watch out for snakes.
- •When you are finished, fill in all holes that are dug at the site.

Community Corner – by Karen Davis

The end of the school year is usually a very busy time and last May I was busier than ever. The Middleton Heights Elementary Librarian happens to be my daughter. The principal of the school wants her to incorporate more STEM activities into her lessons and I volunteered to give rock classes during class library time. Since the kids aren't allowed to check out books the last 2 weeks of school, that meant that all the students in grades K-5th would be getting a 50 minute rock class, 6-7 classes each day, M-Th, with a total of over 500 kids learning about rocks! And boy, were they ever excited!

When they walked into the library 3 large tables of rocks and minerals were on display that they were encouraged to pick up and feel. There were lots of questions!

We gathered each class into a group, showed a short video to teach them the basic types of rocks and how they are formed and from there I showed Pahoehoe Lava vs vesicular basalt, minerals, common rocks and fossils. Samples were passed around so they could see and feel the rocks up close. Of course, the magic floating rock was a big hit but the thing the kids liked the most was when I brought out my UV light and lit up several fluorescent minerals, one glowing a bright hot pink! The 5th graders were given a polished rock to take home and the principal heard all about the "cool" rock classes from the excited students.

Since that very busy week, I have given 3 more classes during the summer to people who have expressed an interest in learning about rocks and where to find them (one family was visiting from Texas!).

Of course, after teaching classes, the kids invariably want to go rock hounding for themselves. So, I have taken several groups on field trips so they can find their own treasures. I get such joy in teaching kids about rocks and minerals and love their enthusiasm as they discover a whole new hobby! Sending my love to all my fellow rock lovers, Karen Davis




OGMS will continue to pay \$120 per five-gallon bucket of nicely tumbled rock.

I will build fires only in designated or safe places and will be certain they are completely extinguished before leaving the area.

I will discard no burning material – matches, cigarettes, etc.

I will fill all excavation holes which may be dangerous to livestock.

I will not contaminate wells, creeks, or other water supplies.

I will cause no willful damage to collecting material and will take home only what I can reasonably use.

I will practice conservation and undertake to utilize fully and well the materials I have collected and will recycle my surplus for the pleasure and benefit of others.

I will support the rockhound project H.E.L.P. (Help Eliminate Litter Please) and will leave all collecting areas devoid of litter, regardless of how found.

I will cooperate with field-trip leaders and those in designated authority in all collecting areas.

I will report to my club or federation officers, Bureau of Land Management or other authorities, any deposit of petrified wood or other materials on public lands which should be protected for the enjoyment of future generations for public educational and scientific purposes.

I will appreciate and protect our heritage of natural resources.

I will observe the "Golden Rule", will use Good Outdoor Manners and will at all times conduct myself in a manner which will add to the stature and Public Image of Rockhounds everywhere.
