June's birthstone is ALEXANDERITE it is one of the most expensive gems. Large stones with good color can cost thousands of dollars per carat. Stones weighing more than 10 carats are considered very large and might be worthy of museum display. The value of an Alexandrite is a function of its size, transparency, and the quality of the color change, as well as the disposition of the marketplace. It was named after Alexander II, Czar of Russia, on whose birthday the gem was discovered. It is also interesting that red and green were the colors of the Russian Imperial Guard.

For those of us that might not be able to afford this stone as our birthstone there are a couple alternatives Pearl and Moonstone so see no one should be left out.

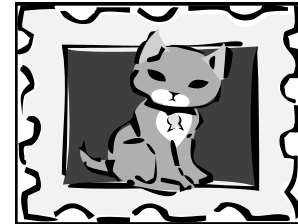
