Buckets, Shovels, Rock Hammer, Pick (Large and Small), Sieve, Gloves, Spray Bottle for Water, Small Scrub Brush, Knee Pads, Magnifier, Plenty of Drinking Water, Food, Appropriate Clothing, Protective Eyewear, Sun Protection, Day Pack or Back Pack, Umbrella, Pry Bar, Tick Spray, First Aid Kit, Protective clothing and sunscreen to avoid burns.

Shovel and fire extinguisher to put out any fires that may start.

- •Trips can last most of the day.
- •Generally, a High-Clearance vehicle and sometimes 4WD or an ATV is required. Check with the Field Trip Chair before you go.
- •Please remember to not park on tall grass or sagebrush as the fire season is in full swing and watch out for snakes.
- •When you are finished, fill in all holes that are dug at the site.

The money raised from this auction will help pay for the holiday dinner in December. Remember to bring your checkbooks/cash, because you will want to buy something!


December—Christmas Party

Hello fellow OGMS members.

I have been so busy giving rock presentations and dealing with church commitments that writing this report was something I just put off. The guilt has finally reached an intolerable level :). So here is my report for the years 2024 & 2025.

One year ago, I gave a presentation to the club showing what I do in my rock classes. Those who were there might remember we played the game, "Are you Smarter Than a 4th grader" and several of you won homemade chocolate chip cookies! At that meeting I gave a report on the success of my rock & mineral presentations. Even I was surprised that at the end of the 2024, I had given 29 rock presentations (1st to 4th grades), to a total of 840 students who learned facts about rocks & minerals, how to use magnifiers, seeing fluorescent minerals up close



and being amazed at the "magic" floating rock (pumice). My classes are very interactive and always generate lots of questions.

And of course, every student was given a polished rock on completion of the presentation.

In Jan. 2025, I posted on a Treasure Valley Homeschool Facebook page that I gave free classes on behalf of OGMS and was overwhelmed with homeschool groups wanting/needing science type classes. I did 11 classes in my garage and for 2 larger groups I went to their homes, and yet several more, I just couldn't fit in. So here are my statistics for 2025: 58 classes that included 1,081 students! What was different about this year? I gave a modified presentation to high school students where they had to study & identify different crystal habits in minerals and they learned and used the Moh's hardness scale to help identify minerals. I also gave out rock/mineral boxes to 4 more schools to help students have a hands on way to learn and put together a simple fossil class for use in my garage/homeschool presentations. Most public schools don't have units on fossils in their curriculum.

I am deeply grateful to all those who have donated rocks...Don Dixon, Cindy Woolsey, John Wright, Diane Rahn and a few others whom I just can't remember your names right now. Thank you! Don donated a hugh piece of soapstone, that I chip small chunks off of, so students can feel "nature's fidget stone". And lastly, I am always asked why I do this for free...it takes hours and hours of my time, I use my own money to supplement my displays, buy magnifiers and of course polish rocks 24/7. The only honest answer I can give... it gives me great satisfaction to teach others what I love and have already learned. These kids are the worlds future geologists, rock hobbyists, petroleum engineers, etc. If I can spark an interest in earth sciences by teaching a bit about rocks and minerals and give them a hands on experience, it gives me a purpose beyond my ordinary life and enriches theirs immensely. If you would like to help teach classes or donate rocks don't hesitate to text me.



- I will fill all excavation holes which may be dangerous to livestock.
- I will not contaminate wells, creeks, or other water supplies.
- I will cause no willful damage to collecting material and will take home only what I can reasonably use.
- I will practice conservation and undertake to utilize fully and well the materials I have collected and will recycle my surplus for the pleasure and benefit of others.
- I will support the rockhound project H.E.L.P. (Help Eliminate Litter Please) and will leave all collecting areas devoid of litter, regardless of how found.
- I will cooperate with field-trip leaders and those in designated authority in all collecting areas.
- I will report to my club or federation officers, Bureau of Land Management or other authorities, any deposit of petrified wood or other materials on public lands which should be protected for the enjoyment of future generations for public educational and scientific purposes.
