OWYHEE GEM & MINERAL SOCIETY GENERAL MEETING MINUTES**September 21, 2016**

The General Meeting was held at the College of Idaho in Caldwell and called to order by President Willa Renken at 7:30 p.m. Willa asked if there were any additions or corrections to the minutes as printed in the newsletter. Hearing none, Ed Moser made a motion to accept the minutes as printed; seconded by Brad Larson, motion carried. Guests were introduced and given a warm welcome. Deputy Chief Fire Marshal, Andrew Carter spoke about the importance of fire safety in the home. He answered many questions and reminded the club it is time to change the batteries in your smoke detectors.

Secretary: Received four membership renewals in the mail.

Vice President: Absent.

Treasurer: The slab drawing took in \$58 in August and the club made \$912 on the auction held in July. Expenses from last month were grit and tumbler repair, and the printing of the newsletter.

Show Chairman: Ideas were talked about for the theme of the gem show next year. Members discussed ideas and voted on using "Come rock with us" for next year. Susan has handed out a lot of tickets for the donated tumbled stones that will be used for the rock bags for the show. The winner will be chosen at the January meeting. The Club is looking for a volunteer to head the 'Wheel of Gems' table at the next Gem Show.

Federation Chairman: Ed presented Brad Larson with certificates he won from the Northwest Federation website contests. Brad placed 5th in website design and 2nd in the web master contest for web design. The club member is needed to volunteer to report BLM information to the NWF website. Remember to save your postage stamps. A total of 48 pounds of stamps were taken to the NWF meeting last July.

Historian: No report.

Sunshine: It was reported that Chuck Murphy and Everett Ensley both passed last month.

Membership Chairman: Welcome new members Gary and Laura Hill from Caldwell. Club dues are due in October. See Kathy if you need to pick up your membership cards and/or patches.

Field Trip Chairman: The September field trip will be to the Big Egg Claim. Last week a tractor was rented and delivered to the claim to do some excavation work on the site. Top soil was pushed aside and the area ripped sideways to break up the dirt for easier digging. The eggs are there but you will still have to work for the material. This plan was voted on last year by the club but the Soda Fire postponed the excavation. Jeri McClarin made a motion to reimburse Willa for the cost of renting the equipment for the excavation of the Big Egg Claim; seconded by Ithel Kildow, motion carried. When you are on a field trip please be mindful of the fire danger and fill in holes when you are finished digging. The Club voted to have a two-day field trip to McDermitt on October 8 & 9. Some of the members would like to have rough material that can be found from the field trips, brought to meetings and displayed to get an idea of what to look for. Also, remember to put some material you find aside for the silent auction.

Webmaster: The website is up to date.

Unfinished Business: The Club will hold elections at the October meeting. If you are interested in holding a position, contact Willa. The club is also looking for a new editor for the newsletter.

New Business: A representative from the committee doing the remodel and restoration of the Evans and Van der Venter gem and mineral collections, gave an update on their progress. They are working on getting the first 6 to 8 cabinets organized and displayed. The collection is usually displayed in the basement of the Boone Hall but has been in storage for the last few years. The collection and display will eventually be open for a half day per week. They would like to have a member from our club help out and to be on their Committee. Let Willa know if you are interested. There will be a road cleanup on October 29. The club voted to have the December Banquet at Orphan Anne's. Brad Larson made a motion for \$50 to honor club member Chuck Murphy and \$100 to honor Lifetime member Everett Ensley to be placed in the Northwest Federation Endowment Fund ; Ed Moser seconded, motion carried.

Slab drawing. Larry Beattie won the door prize. Meeting adjourned at 9:10.

Everett Edwin Ensley, 97, of Wilder, died at September 12, 2016 at a Boise hospital of natural causes. Everett was born in Ainsworth, Nebraska to John L. & Clara L. (Keech) Ensley on July 9, 1919. He had one brother, William "Bill" Ensley, two sisters: Ruth Madine (Ensley) Mintun, Thelma Helen (Ensley) Langer. Everett married the love of his life Evelyn Pearl Shaner on Dec. 12, 1936. They were happily married 78 years until her passing on Feb. 12, 2015. They moved out to Idaho in 1941. They picked cotton in Colorado and worked in the orchards to get here with 25 cents in their pockets when they arrived.

Everett worked as a carpenter most of his life and drove school bus in Wilder. Evelyn worked in onion sheds and hop fields and any odd jobs to feed their family. In 1943, they bought some ground and built a farm, and would work it until they both passed. Beginning in 1944, Everett would serve in the U.S. Army for a few years during WWII, and be honorable discharged in late 1945. He loved dinosaurs, gardening along with traveling. Everett loved his family and was very involved with their lives.

Everett is survived by three sons: Jerry (Margaret) Ensley, Dick (Vivian) Ensley and Bob (Mary Sue) Ensley, a daughter, Linda (Jerry) Collingham: 13 grandchildren, 39 great-grandchildren, 40 great-great-grandchildren. He is preceded in death by his wife, Evelyn, his parents, his brother, and two sisters, two great-grandsons: Michael Everett Ensley, Brandon Curtis Morton. 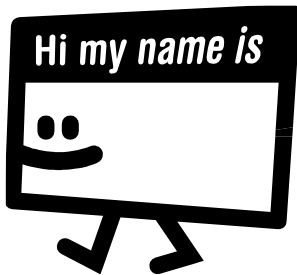
